. CALL TO ORDER

III. DEPARTMENT OF RADIOLOGY REPORT

Vital Rangashamanna, M.D. Representative, Radiology

Dr. Rangashamanna provided an update from the Department of Radiology:

Q&A

- **Q:** What are some of the reasons that your department finds it difficult to retain faculty?
- **A:** The radiology market is difficult and people get quite a few job offers. We lost faculty due to family reasons, some found better opportunities, and others stopped night rotations.
- Q: Does that put an impact on residents, teaching, and services?
- **A:** This has a major impact and is overloading faculty. We recruited someone for mammography and body imaging. We still don't have replacements for neuroradiology or interventional radiology. We plan to fill these positions in the upcoming months.
- **Q:** How often is there an Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) review of the residency program? Does that happen every couple of years?
- A: Over the last 4-years there have been two reviews. Previously, there were citations but most of these were corrected. Earlier this year, there were no citations.
- **Q:** There are some nice upgrades for the residents such as the reading room for the Texas Tech facilities. Do the other associated clinical sites have the appropriate equipment (PACS system,

imaging equipment, etc.) to support the needs of the program? There were CT scanner outages for a while. Have any of these impacted the program?

A: We have a new area in the basement of the clinic building that is well equipped. They are also adding two PACS systems. One is working with UMC. To my knowledge, Texas Tech is working to acquire a new pack system, different from UMC. I am unsure of the timeline.

Q&A

- **Q:** Regarding the staff shortages, are candidates applying and not getting hired? Or are we not receiving applicants at all?
- A: It is a combination of both. Very few are qualified that have enough GME experience, since the field is very narrow. There is also a learning curve when they join the department which takes about over a year. There are a lot of local market changes and other programs can sometimes offer better compensation. We have people who would have done very well in the position, but they received better competitive offers. We need to make it attractive financially but also provide a career plan with opportunities for advancement.
- **Q:** Recently the Faculty Council discussed staff shortages in general and how staff were leaving to either other departments within the university or leaving the institution because the school was not able to promote or compensate them adequately. We discussed how it is a disservice to our staff and we are losing them because of that. Can you comment?
- A: In medicine, you obtain board certification as recognition that you are trained to do your assigned job. We hope departments can create a similar incentive for staff. Once they achieve that level, it will reflect in their compensation and they don't have to move away from their departments. Right now, this is contingent upon the departments and is an administrative and budgetary decision. There are institutions where the GME office manages a budget for coordinators internally, but in our institution, it is a departmental-based decision to increase pay or incentive. That is the challenge for us when we are in the committee making decisions or recommendations.




Residency Program


Residency Program








- Started negotiations for the 2022-2023 UMC resident agreement contract






Upcoming actions
