I. CALL TO ORDER

Dr. Alok Dwivedi, Faculty Council President, welcomed all attendees joining in-person and via WebEx. He called the March 18, 2024 Faculty Council meeting to order at 12:02 PM. Quorum was met.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Faculty Council meeting minutes from February 19, 2024 were approved as presented.

The approval followed a question by a Faculty Council member on whether there is an action plan the Faculty Council can provide to address the concerns of retention and recruitment raised at the last meeting. Dr. Dwivedi replied that at this time, the Council has not received suggestions, however this could be one of the topics for the governance retreat. A brief discussion ensued on how these topics can be elevated to leadership. A request will be made with the dean to hold a meeting to follow-up on these topics.

Faculty opined that it is important that all departments address the issues of retention and recruitment and generate pro-active solutions. During their departmental report, the Department of Pediatrics presented some solutions and steps that could be supported. It was noted there has been a change in leadership in the department chair for pediatrics, and that an interim chair is implementing new strategies.

A Faculty Council member questioned whether a plan is already in motion to obtain responses on these topics by leadership or whether a motion needs to be made. Dr. Dwivedi stated there is an annual meeting during which faculty concerns will be presented to the leadership. Dr. Lange has an opportunity to address concerns in the general faculty meeting. Faculty Council may expect a response at that time.

FSOM Diversity Statement Revision Alok Dwivedi, Ph.D. Dr. Dwivedi announced that the Diversity Statement presented by Dr. Maureen Francis, Associate Dean PLFSOM Faculty Council President for Medical Education and approved by Faculty Council in January, had since been reviewed and approved by the Dean with additional edits. The final version of the Diversity Statement was presented to the Faculty Council for their information: "Texas Tech University Health Science Center El Paso (TTUHSC El Paso) is a Hispanic Serving Institution situated on the US-Mexico border that is committed to addressing current and emerging health concerns affecting the El Paso community, our region and beyond. Grounded in the compelling evidence that diversity of thought and perspective provides richer solutions to complex challenges, the Paul L. Foster School of Medicine strives to recruit, develop, and retain those best prepared to support its mission. With these intentions, and mindful of our setting, regional history, and status as a state sponsored school in Texas, the Paul L. Foster School of Medicine emphasizes and encourages the recruitment of students from diversity actively recruits students from the following categories divergent and various backgrounds: s\u00e4tudents who are from the US/Mexico border region, who are economically disadvantaged, and those who identify as first generation. PLFSOM Faculty Council President	 Q: When is the annual department report for Family Medicine? A: A schedule for the presentation of department reports by Faculty Council representatives will be distributed.
	 Q: Is it possible to get an update on the mid-point review application reports for Family Medicine? A: Dr. Aung commented that Family Medicine is the only department whose reports have not yet been released. They will be released soon.
	Q: What is the timeframe for the next cycle for promotion and tenure?
	A: Last year's promotion and tenure cycle just closed in February. The announcement with the faculty awarded tenure and granted promotion was sent out to the campus.
	The application cycle for 2024 – 2025 tenure and promotion will be opened in April. Unlike the mid-poin review process in which faculty members may elect to participate, the actual tenure and promotion review is a chair-driven process. If faculty members are interested in going up for promotion, open discussion with their department chair is encouraged. Faculty may only enter the tenure and promotion cycle if the chair nominates the faculty as a candidate for tenure and/or promotion.
	The mid-point review is faculty driven. Participation for non-tenure track faculty members is optional, be strongly encouraged. For faculty members on the tenure track, participation in the mid-point review is mandatory. Mid-point review is intended to occur at the mid-point of the faculty lifecycle in each

academic rank. Since the time in rank is 6 to 7 years, the mid-point review will occur at the 3 to 3 ½ year mark. Faculty are encouraged to participate in the mid-point review if they have been in their rank for

Round Table Discussion Continued	A mid-point review report represents a projection, if the faculty member continues with the same momentum, that the faculty member is likely to be ready for promotion and tenure application in the next 3 to 3 ½ years. It is not intended for a faculty member who participated in the mid-point review to apply for promotion and/or tenure in the following cycle.
	Dr. Aung announced that once the chair has made the nominations, the faculty members will be contacted to attend workshops to review the timeline and application process. Now is a good time to look for external letter writers. It would be beneficial to consider this step early to identify referees that meet the criteria to submit letters of recommendation. Faculty should choose external letter writers from different sources when possible, which is better received than letters from one department or university. Seek advice from your chair as they can help guide you in the right direction when selecting referees.

COMMITTEE CHARGE


The Committee shall have full authority to select members of the medical school entering class based on the screening assessments and interview evaluation reports and to fill vacancies that may occur in any of the medical school classes. A list of recommended candidates to be offered positions through the Texas Medical and Dental School Application Service (TMDSAS) matching process will be prepared based on a ranking determined following deliberations by the Committee. The Committee also shall have the responsibility to review the requirements for admission and, if necessary, to recommend revisions to the faculty.



ACTIONS TAKEN SINCE LAST REPORT

- Last report given Oct 16, 2023
- For EY24: Received 4528 primary applications & 2940 completed applications
- Completed 614 interviews, 25 interview days
- > Redistributed race considerations to increase value of socioeconomic status and regional considerations
- Current tentative roster for class of 2028: MCAT 510, GPA 3.9, 13 OOS, 26 El Pasoans, 41 Border County, 6 Black, 39 LHS+, 36 low SES, 20 1st gen, goal is 124 entering students (currently at 143)
- ▶ 20 Scholarships have been awarded including 16 Foster awards (\$15,000 annually)
- First MedFuture Cohort currently Freshman at UTEP, second cohort to be announced late Spring

UPCOMING ACTIONS

- In rolling admissions through late May/early June to sit 124 new students for EY2024
- Scholarship Sub-Committee will meet to award remaining 29 scholarships ranging from \$1,000-\$10,000/year
- >EY 2025 cycle opens up in May with goal to sit 138
- Need to interview 690 this season, evaluators will be needed
- ➤ Application and Re-applicant workshops scheduled in March/April
- >JAMP Summer II Internship starts May 28th



CURRENT ISSUES/CONCERNS

- ➤ With current model we will not have sufficient # of evaluators to meet goal of 690 interviews
- Anticipating class size expansion to 150 we will need to interview more candidates to meet demand
- Faculty are overextended and not enough willing participants.
- Filling committee vacancies will help us meet quorum and increase evaluators, filling these vacancies has been challenging
